



CPCCLTC4001A LICENCE TO OPERATE A TOWER CRANE

Course Description

This unit will provide applicants with the skills, knowledge and information to safely operate a tower crane, and to enable them to undertake assessment with a SafeWork SA registered Assessor for a licence to perform High Risk Work. Units are based on the requirements of the National Standards for Licensing Persons Performing High Risk Work.

This unit specifies the outcomes required to operate a tower crane for licensing purposes, and covers a jib or boom/job crane mounted on a tower structure, demountable or permanent, including both horizontal and luffing jib types. This unit does not cover self-erecting tower cranes.

Contents

- identifying workplace hazards, control measures and appropriate standards,
- communication techniques
- load calculations
- planning work
- conducting routine checks
- rated capacity and load limits
- transferring loads
- maintenance of tower cranes
- Shutting down and securing a tower crane.

Entry Requirements

- There are no pre-requisites for this unit; however the minimum age for licensing is 18 years.
- To obtain a licence, applicants must be able to provide 100 points of identification to Service SA or Australia Post along with the WHS Statutory Authority Invoice and Notice of Satisfactory Assessment issued via your Assessor.
